Other initiatives include planning and strategizing estate transition; researching early installations, photographic works, sculptures, and exhibitions; conducting artist interviews; inventorying the artist’s library; cataloguing and handling works on paper, photographs, sketchbooks, and paintings; maintaining the artist’s CV and biography; and researching the artist’s personal collection.
